The Lattice Stitch

Crochet Pattern (UK Terms)

You will need:


You will need:

- Crochet Hook 4-5mm depending on tension
- 25g DK wool colour of your choice


Useful abbreviations to read pattern

- **St** – stitch **Sts** – stitches
- **Slst** – Slipstitch **StM** – Stitch Marker
- **Ch** – chain
- **htr** – half treble crochet

Special Stitch: Lattice Stitch



Worked over 2 stitches: 1 half treble followed by a slip stitch in the next stitch

YO, insert into st, YO bring back (3 loops on hook), YO and go through all three loops on the hook, then slip stitch in the next st.

Make sure the htr is worked in the gap between the 2 htr on the previous row from row 2 upwards otherwise the lattice effect will be less pronounced

Pattern (Multiple of 2 + 2 ch for turning)

If you are joining to the other squares, then make sure that the foundation row is 8 inches. If your row 0 is smaller than 8 inches in length, then add multiples of 2 chain until it makes 8 inches in width, then add 2 ch to turn.

This is a dual sided pattern so there is a no wrong or right side.

- ❑ **Row 0:** Chain 24 + 2ch – see note above for width
- ❑ **Row 1:** 1 htr into 3rd ch from hook, slipstitch into the next st, * 1 htr, slipstitch – repeat from * in each st along
- ❑ **Row 2:** Ch2, turn work – now make Slst into the top of htr and htr into the gap between htr on the previous row (see picture above)
- ❑ **Row 3:** Repeat row 2 until the required height is reached. Tie off and weave in ends.

Finishing

- ❑ Add a border of 1 double crochet (dc) evenly spaced around the edges with 3 dc in the corner stitches.
