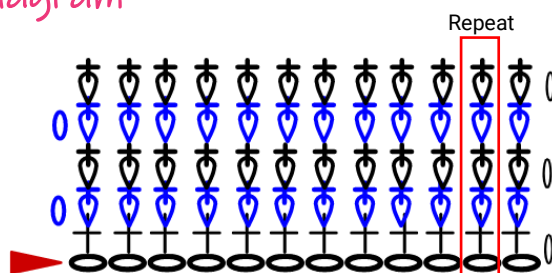
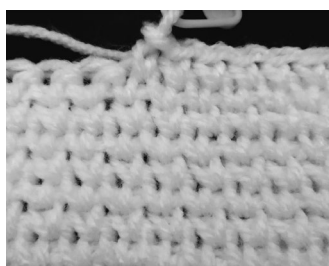
Waistcoat Stitch

Crochet Pattern (UK Terms)

You will need:

You will need:	Useful abbreviations to read pattern
<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ Crochet Hook 4 and 5mm ▪ 25g DK wool colour of your choice 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ St – stitch Sts – stitches ▪ Slst – Slipstitch StM – Stitch Marker ▪ Ch – chain ▪ Dc – double crochet

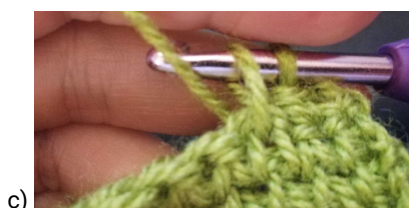
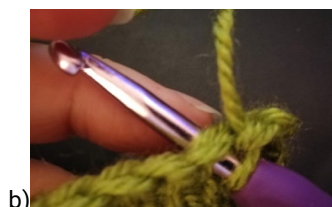
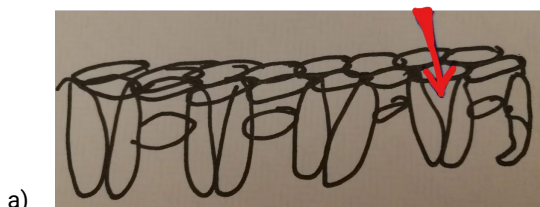
- When working the waistcoat stitch in the flat the V will be slightly offset, when working in the round the stitch will be perfectly aligned.
- You will need to complete the first two rows in a larger hook as it will make it easier to work that first row into the post.

Pattern (Multiple of 1 + 1 ch for turning)

If you are joining to the other squares, then make sure that the foundation row is 8 inches. If your row 0 is smaller than 8 inches in length, then add multiples of 1 chain until it makes 8 inches in width, then add 1ch to turn.

This is a dual sided pattern so there is a no wrong or right side.

- ❑ **Row 0: [Using 5mm hook]** Chain 24 + 1ch – see note above for width
- ❑ **Row 1:** 1dc in 2nd ch from hook, 1 dc in remaining sts across
- ❑ **Row 2: [Using 4mm hook]** ch1, turn work, 1dc into each POST (between the V – see picture a & c below) of the previous row dc stitch until the last st, then 1dc into the top of the turning chain.
 - ❑ **Make sure when you go through the V that you work through 2 loops (picture b) otherwise one side will look different to the other!!**



- ❑ **Row 3+:** Repeat row 2 until desired height reached – tie off and weave in ends or complete border below

Finishing

- ❑ Add a border of 1 double crochet (dc) evenly spaced around the edges with 3 dc in the corner stitches.
