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Snapdragon Hooded Wrap with Pockets

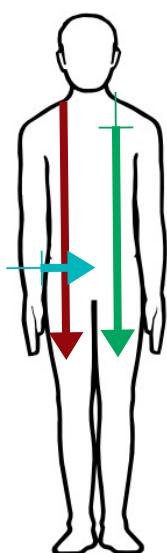
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1 Introduction

This pattern is all about comfort and snuggles, whether it be out on a walk or just keeping you warm whilst reading on the sofa. This scarf has been designed to enable you to tailor the size from adult to child. It is made in two parts, the scarf and then the hood. There are optional buttons down the front to help hold the scarf in place if you want to wear it like a half gilet. You can make using DK or Aran yarn and hook and recommended yarn is suggested for both.

This pattern was created for use by the MK Crochet Group and the KCG UK members. This pattern is **not for sale**, but items created using it can be sold where **evenrobotsneedblankets** is credited as the designer. Thanks xxx

2 Finished measurements



- (a) Using a tape measure start mid thigh (or the length point on the torso you want the scarf to reach) and measure the length from one side, around the neck and then back to the same point on the opposite leg. **Put this measurement in the table below in total length**
- (b) Take a measurement from the collarbone to the same point on the thigh as the red measurement. **Put this measurement in the table below in measurement from shoulder.**
- (c) Take (a) - ((b) x 2) to get the **length of the hood**
- Measure from the side of hip to bellybutton to get the **height** (default child 15cm / Adult 30cm)

You can record your custom measurements in the table below in **Row 4** so you can refer to them as you use the pattern where prompted. If you just want to make a standard size use either adult or child.

- Row 1 is an **example**
- Row 2 is default **adult** size
- Row 3 is default **child** size.

3 Terminology

This pattern is written using standard UK crochet terminology, yarn weights and hook sizes.

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4 Difficulty Level

This pattern is intermediate level and assumes the reader has experience of basic crochet stitches as listed in the stitch reference list.

If you are not familiar with the Snapdragon stitch please try the sample (see section 9) before starting.

5 Pattern abbreviations

This table contains the stitch and pattern abbreviations along with a reminder how to (where applicable):

Abbreviation	Meaning	Description
slst	0	0
dc	0	0
tr	0	0
ch	0	0
3-tr	0	Make 3 tr into the same st
5-tr	5 Treble Fan	Make 5 tr into the same st

6 Equipment

- **Hook Size(s)**
 - **DK:** 6mm standard crochet hook
 - **Aran:** 8mm standard crochet hook
- Stitch Marker x3 for keeping track of positions
- Tapestry Needle for weaving in ends and joining
- Scissors or yarn cutter to trim off yarn ends
- Shawl pin to hold the wrap together

7 Yarn

The Snapdragon Hooded Wrap in the photos was made with Sirdar Jewelspun Aran, but any other brand of DK or Aran yarn will work. **This pattern is not affiliated with SIRDAR or STYLECRAFT** – it is just what I had in my yarn cupboard 😊.

I have put the shade codes in the materials list to help you colour match and find a substitute using the fantastic website <https://yarnsub.com/>

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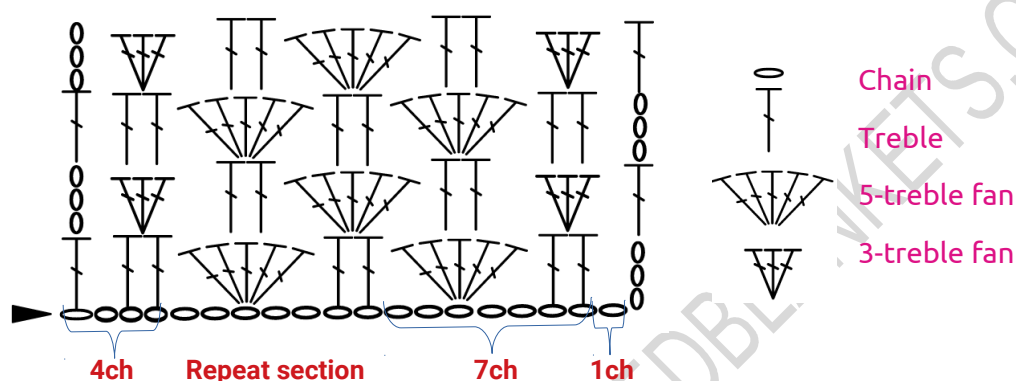
8 Snapdragon Stitch Practice

In this section you will get an overview of the main pattern stitch which is the Snapdragon stitch. If you are familiar with this stitch then you can skip to the main pattern. The instructions below will give you a sample square of the stitch which will practice the start, middle and end of the row for the two row repeat. **Hint:** As you need to make 2 pockets for the finished item, you can use this pattern below for Adults and produce a 8 inch square twice.

8.1 You will need

- 5mm standard crochet hook
- 25g DK yarn any colour

8.2 Snapdragon diagram



The pattern is repeated over a section of 7 chains with an additional 5 chains split over the start and end of the row.

8.3 Sample Pattern (multiple of 7 + 5ch)

If your row 0 is smaller than 8 inches in length, then add multiples of 7 chain + 5ch until it makes approximately 8 inches in width.

- ❑ **Row 0 :** Chain 19 + 3ch for turning
- ❑ **Row 1:** Tr into 5th ch from hook, 1tr into next st, * skip 2 sts, 5-tr into next st, skip 2 sts, 1 tr in next 2 sts, - repeat from * across **until 4 sts left** then 1 tr in next 2 sts, skip next st, 1 tr into last st
- ❑ **Row 2:** ch3, 3-tr into middle of 2tr from previous row, * 1tr into 2nd gap of fan from previous row, 1 tr into 3rd gap of fan from previous row, 5-tr into middle of 2tr from previous row – repeat from * across **until last 2tr from previous row reached**, then 3-tr into middle of 2tr from previous row, 1 tr into top of ch3 from previous row.
- ❑ **Row 3:** ch3, 1 tr into 1st gap of 3-tr from previous row, 1 tr into 2nd gap of 3tr from previous row, * 1tr into 2nd gap of fan from previous row, 1 tr into 3rd gap of fan from previous row, 5-tr into middle of 2tr from previous row – repeat from * across **until last 3-tr fan from previous row reached**, then 1 tr into 1st gap of 3-tr from previous row, 1 tr into 2nd gap of 3tr from previous row, 1 tr into top of ch3 from previous row.
- ❑ Repeat row 2 and 3 until desired height reached or you are confident with working the pattern repeat.

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9 Main Pattern

9.1 Pattern Notes

- At the start of each row place a stitch marker (StM) in the 3rd ch stitch (unless otherwise told). This will help you to always put the last treble of the row in the correct stitch.
- The pattern using the recommended yarn is a single colour, but you can change colours every row or couple of rows – its completely up to you!!

9.2 Pattern: Main wrap

- ❑ **Row 0:** Chain length to match total length (*see section 2: Finished Measurements*) making sure that length is multiples of 7ch + 5ch + 3ch for turning
 - ❑ Example 1: Length of 500ch (500ch – (5ch + 3ch) = 492ch /7 = 70.28 therefore this will not work as 492 is NOT divisible by 7ch
 - ❑ Example 2: Length of 498 (498 – (5ch + 3ch) = 490ch /7 = 70 so this will work for the pattern
- ❑ **Row 1:** Tr into 5th ch from hook, 1tr into next st, * skip 2 sts, 5-tr into next st, skip 2 sts, 1 tr in next 2 sts, - repeat from * across **until 4 sts left** then 1 tr in next 2 sts, skip next st, 1 tr into last st
- ❑ **Row 2:** ch3, turn work, 3-tr into middle of 2tr from previous row, * 1tr into 2nd gap of fan from previous row, 1 tr into 3rd gap of fan from previous row, 5-tr into middle of 2tr from previous row – repeat from * across **until last 2tr from previous row reached**, then 3-tr into middle of 2tr from previous row, 1 tr into top of ch3 from previous row.
- ❑ **Row 3:** ch3, turn work, 1 tr into 1st gap of 3-tr from previous row, 1 tr into 2nd gap of 3tr from previous row, * 1tr into 2nd gap of fan from previous row, 1 tr into 3rd gap of fan from previous row, 5-tr into middle of 2tr from previous row – repeat from * across **until last 3-tr fan from previous row reached**, then 1 tr into 1st gap of 3-tr from previous row, 1 tr into 2nd gap of 3tr from previous row, 1 tr into top of ch3 from previous row.
- ❑ Repeat row 2 and 3 until desired height (*see section 2: Finished Measurements*) has been reached making sure you finish on a Row 3 repeat.
- ❑ **Row 4:** ch3, turn work, dc into middle of 2tr from previous row, * ch4, 1dc into 2nd gap of fan from previous row, ch1, 1 dc into 3rd gap of fan from previous row, dc into middle of 2tr from previous row – repeat from * across **until last 2tr from previous row reached**, then dc into middle of 2tr from previous row, ch3 and slst into top of ch3 from previous row.

9.3 Pattern: Hood

Before starting the hood fold wrap in two lengthways. Along the foundation row side of the wrap put a Stitch Marker (StM) at the mid point (green). Using the Hood (*see section 2: Finished Measurements*) measurement divided by 2 measure the length on either side of the mid point and put a StM (red). The length between the 1st and 3rd StM should match the Hood measurement.



However before starting make sure that the number of chains is divisible by the multiple (as before – see row 0 of main pattern for guide). If not then adjust the StMs until the number of chains between 1st and 3rd StM can be divided by the multiple.

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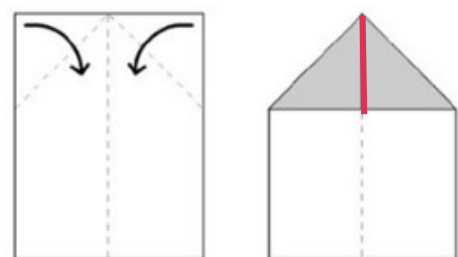
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Please note: As the hood is worked on the other side of the foundation row the Snapdragon stitch will be in the opposite direction (see picture below).



Instructions:

- ❑ **Row 1:** Join yarn into ch marked by 1st ch - Tr into 5th ch from hook, 1tr into next st, * skip 2 sts, 5-tr into next st, skip 2 sts, 1 tr in next 2 sts, - repeat from * across **until 4 sts left until 3rd StM** then 1 tr in next 2 sts, skip next st, 1 tr into last st
- ❑ **Row 2:** ch3, turn work, 3-tr into middle of 2tr from previous row, * 1tr into 2nd gap of fan from previous row, 1 tr into 3rd gap of fan from previous row, 5-tr into middle of 2tr from previous row – repeat from * across **until last 2tr from previous row reached**, then 3-tr into middle of 2tr from previous row, 1 tr into top of ch3 from previous row.
- ❑ **Row 3:** ch3, turn work, 1 tr into 1st gap of 3-tr from previous row, 1 tr into 2nd gap of 3tr from previous row, * 1tr into 2nd gap of fan from previous row, 1 tr into 3rd gap of fan from previous row, 5-tr into middle of 2tr from previous row – repeat from * across **until last 3-tr fan from previous row reached**, then 1 tr into 1st gap of 3-tr from previous row, 1 tr into 2nd gap of 3tr from previous row, 1 tr into top of ch3 from previous row.
- ❑ Repeat row 2 and 3 until desired height (*see section 2: Finished Measurements Hood*) has been reached making sure you finish on a Row 3 repeat.
- ❑ **Row 4:** ch3, turn work, dc into middle of 2tr from previous row, * ch4, 1dc into 2nd gap of fan from previous row, ch1, 1 dc into 3rd gap of fan from previous row, dc into middle of 2tr from previous row – repeat from * across **until last 2tr from previous row reached**, then dc into middle of 2tr from previous row, ch3 and slst into top of ch3 from previous row.
- ❑ **Row 5:** Fold the sides together and then slipstitch along the red line. Tie off and weave in ends.



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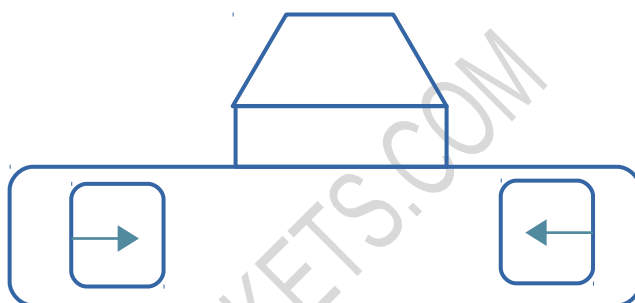
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9.4 Pattern: Pockets

For the pockets (make two)

- **Adults:** use pattern for sample and make two 8 inch squares
- **Child:** use sample pattern with a foundation ch of 12ch (7ch + 5ch) only to make a small pocket.

Place pockets as per the diagram below and sew around three sides leaving the side where the arrow is pointing open. Note: the stitch direction will be at 90° rotation when attaching (see picture below)



9.5 Finishing

- ❑ **Row 0:** Join yarn at mid point of the bottom of the wrap. Ch1, work 1 dc around the edge of the piece making 3dc in the corner points twice.
- ❑ Use a shawl pin to hold the wrap together.
