## The Pique Stitch

Crochet Pattern (UK Terms)

You will need:

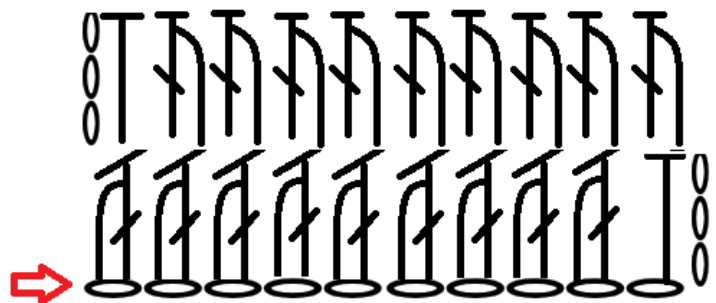
You will need:

- Crochet Hook 4-5mm depending on tension
- 25g DK wool colour of your choice

Useful abbreviations to read pattern

- **St** – stitch **Sts** – stitches
- **Slst** – Slipstitch **StM** – Stitch Marker
- **Ch** – chain
- **tr** – treble crochet
- **dc** – double crochet

Special Stitch: Pique Group Stitch

- ❑ 1 treble and 1htr in the same st worked as follows:
  - YO, insert into st, YO bring back (3 loops on hook), YO and go through first 2 loops on hook, YO insert into same st, YO bring back (4 loops on hook) , YO and bring through all 4 loops

Pattern (Multiple of 1 + 3ch)

If you are joining to the other squares, then make sure that the foundation row is 8 inches. If your row 0 is smaller than 8 inches in length, then add multiples of 1 chain until it makes 8 inches in width, then add 3 ch to turn.

This is a dual sided pattern so there is a no wrong or right side.

- ❑ **Row 0:** Chain 22 + 3ch – see note above for width
- ❑ **Row 1:** 1 tr into 4th ch from hook, 1 Pique Group st (see Special Stitches above) in each st along
- ❑ **Row 2:** Ch3, turn work, 1 tr into 1<sup>st</sup> st, 1 Pique Group stitch (see Special Stitches above) in each st along
- ❑ **Row 3:** Repeat row 2 until the required height is reached. Tie off and weave in ends

Finishing

- ❑ Add a border of 1 double crochet (dc) evenly spaced around the edges with 3 dc in the corner stitches.
