Slant Stitch Square

Crochet Pattern (UK Terms)

You will need:

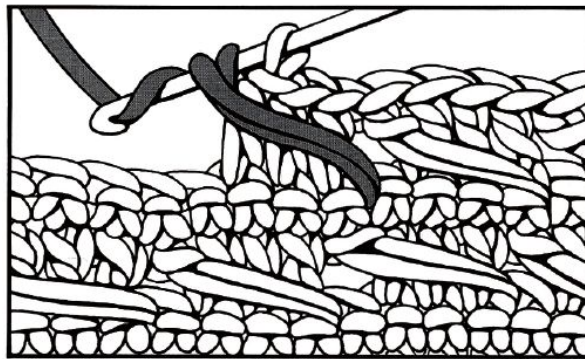
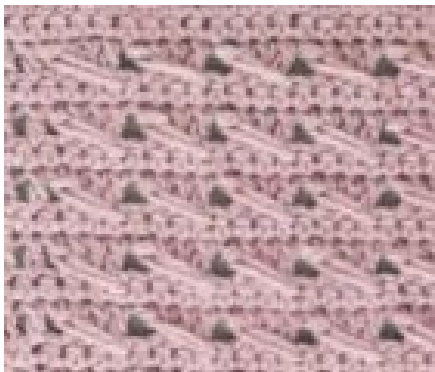
You will need:

- Crochet Hook 5mm
- 25g DK wool colour of your choice

Useful abbreviations to read pattern

- **St** – stitch **Sts** – stitches **Slst** – Slipstitch **StM** – Stitch Marker
- **Ch** – chain
- **dc** – double crochet
- **tr** – treble crochet

Diagram



The slant stitch is made by going back on yourself so that it wraps around the last three treble stitches. May seem a bit weird at the beginning, but the end effect is worth it 😊 Just remember not to work the wrap stitch too tightly around the treble stitches.

Pattern (multiple of 4 + 1 ch)

If you are joining to the other squares, then make sure that the foundation row is 8 inches. If your initial row is smaller than 8 inches, then add multiples of 4 chains until it makes 8 inches in width.

[ROW 0]. [FOUNDATION ROW] Chain 25 (or a multiple of 4 + 1 which reaches 8 inches in width)

[ROW 1]. Dc into 2nd chain from hook, 1 dc into each remaining ch across

[ROW 2]. Ch3 (counts as first tr), turn work, tr, * skip stitch, 3 tr, yarn over and insert hook in skipped stitch, yarn over and bring back through and finish off tr – repeat from * across until last two stitches, tr in last two stitches

[ROW 3]. Ch1, turn work, Dc into 2nd chain from hook, 1 dc into each remaining ch across

[ROW 4]. Ch3 (counts as first tr), turn work, tr, * skip stitch, 3 tr, yarn over and insert hook in skipped stitch, yarn over and bring back through and finish off tr – repeat from * across until last two stitches, tr in last two stitches

[ROW 5]. Repeat row 3 and 4 until work measures 8 inches in height

[ROW 6]. DO NOT TIE OFF – work 1 dc evenly spaced around the entire edge of the piece making sure you put 3dc into the corner stitch. Slipstitch to join – tie off and weave in ends.
